



## **“NORTH TO SOUTH” 8 night SPECIAL – 01 June-31 October 2026**

4 nights in the Jackalberry Treehouse at Flatdogs Camp & 4 nights at Kutandala Bushcamp in the North Luangwa National Park

***A brand new combination we are really excited to share – starting in your own private Treehouse with views onto a game-rich waterhole, before heading into the North Luangwa National Park, an isolated wilderness area where you can explore on foot or by vehicle with outstanding guides.***

Day 1 Please check in for your flight to Mfuwe from Lusaka airport domestic terminal. Whilst the luggage limit for your internal flights with Proflight Zambia is 23kgs plus 5kgs hand luggage, the smaller light aircraft flights have a limit of 15kgs plus 5kgs hand luggage, in soft sided bags only.

Lusaka – Mfuwe Proflight Zambia  
Timings are 0655/0805 or 1035/1145 or 1635/1745 depending on the season and the day of the week.

You will be met at Mfuwe airport by one of our safari guides and transferred to camp (+/- 30 minutes)

### **Day 1-5 JACKALBERRY TREEHOUSE AT FLATDOGS CAMP – 4 nights**

Flatdogs Camp is situated on the Luangwa River opposite the Mfuwe area of the South Luangwa National Park; an area where the wildlife has been protected for so

many years that game almost entirely ignores safari vehicles, allowing guests to have some incredible sightings of predators,



including leopard, lion and wild dog as well as the huge variety of other species found in the South Luangwa.

You will be staying in the unique Jackalberry Treehouse here at Flatdogs Camp; your own private eeyrie looking out onto a floodplain dotted with acacia and sausage trees. The Treehouse has been created with three teak platforms built

around three beautiful living Mchenja trees (African Ebony or Jackalberry tree), some grass walls and a thatched covering over your bed.



The whole of the front of the Treehouse is open, allowing you to sleep “under the stars” and feel part of this thrilling

landscape where you may be awoken by a family of elephant taking an early morning mud-bath in front of you, or a giraffe pausing for a drink. Set away from the rest of camp, and surrounded by fairly thick indigenous trees and bushes, we need to transfer you to and from the house by vehicle for safety. You will have a hand-held walkie-talkie at the Treehouse so you can call to order



your meals or to have a vehicle to come and collect you either for your safaris or to head up to the pool at camp. There is also a private hide built underneath the Treehouse which you can access for even more photographic opportunities!

If you arrive on the morning flight, there is time to settle in and have some lunch before being collected from the Treehouse by your safari guide at around 3.15pm and driven up to the main part of camp to meet the rest of us for tea.



You and your guide will head off into the Park as soon as you’re ready and start to explore this area of the Park, listening out for alarm calls to follow and enjoying the animals, birds and differing habitats found in this area. You will stop most likely at a scenic spot on the river or a lagoon to watch the

infamous African sunset and for night to fall before continuing on with a spotlight, looking for some of our nocturnal species. Lion, leopard, hyena, fishing owl, civet, porcupine and genet are some of the nocturnal species regularly seen. You will return to camp between 7.30 and 8pm, depending on the season, but in time for dinner which you can either have up at camp, or on your private dining deck at the Treehouse.

In the mornings, your guide will pick you up at around 0530 and bring you up to the restaurant where you can take a light breakfast of toast and cereal before heading into the Park to further explore or maybe return to an exciting sighting from the night before to see what has developed. Guides here in the South Luangwa have to take in depth examinations in order to qualify as



professional guides and are specialist naturalists, knowledgeable in all aspects of the Park, from the wildlife and birds, to the trees and shrubs on which they feed, animal behaviour & ecology, conservation principles and the history of the Park.

Usually we return to camp just after ten in time for either a big cooked breakfast or a brunch type lunch, whichever you would prefer (or both!). Our a la carte restaurant is open all day, so you can choose to eat when you are hungry and all meals and snacks are included. You can then relax during the heat of the day, sitting in the Treehouse watching what game comes to the waterhole, or head up to camp to sit on the river bank next to the swimming pool, or if you are interested in seeing more of the Mfuwe area, we can happily organize to take you up to the village where you can spend a couple of hours visiting the local markets, the local schools we are supporting, the rural health clinic, the nearby anti-poaching base and some of the local conservation and community projects.

The safari package includes your private accommodation in the Treehouse, all meals, shared safari activities, National Park Entry fees, LCCF, laundry and airport and inter-camp transfers. Not included are drinks from the bar or items of a personal nature like shop purchases or internet use.





## Day 5

We will transfer you back to Mfuwe airport for your small light aircraft flight upto the North Luangwa National Park. The timing for this flight will only be confirmed closer to the time of travel but it will be a scenic flight, over the whole of the South Luangwa, usually following the meanders of the Luangwa river which is fascinating to see from the air. The plane used can be as small as a 2 seater Cessna, so please be aware that there is a strict luggage limit of 15kgs per person in the hold plus 5kgs hand luggage and bags need to be soft sided, no rigid frames or wheels will fit in the hold.

## Day 5-9

### **KUTANDALA BUSH CAMP – 4 nights**

This beautiful little camp sits in the heart of North Luangwa National Park; an undeveloped wildlife haven, protected for the last 30+ years by the Frankfurt Zoological Society working with Zambia's DNPW. Since Mark & Delia Owens' days, the Park has gone from strength to strength with a pinnacle being the re-introduction of black rhino to the Park.

The rhino are not commonly seen by visitors, but by visiting the Park, you are contributing to their ongoing conservation and protection. Kutandala offers an exclusive and truly wild safari experience in the classic bush camp style. The five guest tented rooms are simple, but with all you need – solar fans during warmer weather and ensuite semi-open bathrooms with hot



bucket showers on request.

The camp looks onto the clear-flowing Mwaleshi river which attracts game all year round. Classic Zambia concentrate on the quality of their guiding and during your game drives and walking safaris in this peaceful Park, they will be able to interpret and explain all you come across in the

most interesting way. Your daily itinerary is similar to other safari camps – aiming to be up at first light, ready to explore the Park whilst the animals are

most active, then returning to camp for a brunch/lunch type meal and time to enjoy the sounds of the bush or watching an elephant herd meander past your room before heading back into the Park for more adventure. From camp you can enjoy game drives, including night drives and walking safaris. Your safari package includes your tented accommodation, all meals, all safari activities, Park Entry fees, Conservation fees, laundry (underwear not included) and drinks. Please be aware that the remote nature of this bushcamp means that there is no Wifi available.



Day 9 You will be transferred back through the Park to Mwaleshi bush air strip for your light aircraft charter flight back to Mfuwe airport to connect with your flight back to Lusaka.

Not included are Visa fees for Zambia if required, drinks while at Flatdogs Camp, gratuities or items of a personal nature.
